## Right to Know Central File



Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 8:59-7.2(d) A public employer shall, upon written request, provide an employee or employee representative with a copy of a Right to Know survey, appropriate hazardous substance fact sheets and, if applicable, material safety data sheets, at no cost. This information shall be provided as soon as possible but at the latest within five working days of the request. For a mixture, a public employer shall, upon written request, provide an employee or employee representative with a copy of the appropriate material safety data sheet.

In accordance with the provisions of The Worker and Community Right to Know Act (N.J.S.A. 34:5A – section 12) and The Worker and Community Right to Know Act Rules (N.J.A.C. 8:59 – section 7.2), the following documents are available online at <a href="https://www.nj.gov/health/rtkweb">www.nj.gov/health/rtkweb</a>:

**Note:** Allowing employee access to the Right to Know Program website from the workplace during the work shift satisfies the requirements to provide employee access to the Right to Know Hazardous Substance List and Hazardous Substance Fact Sheets.

Employers must also provide employees a copy of the facility's Right to Know Survey and Survey Updates and any applicable material safety data sheets.
